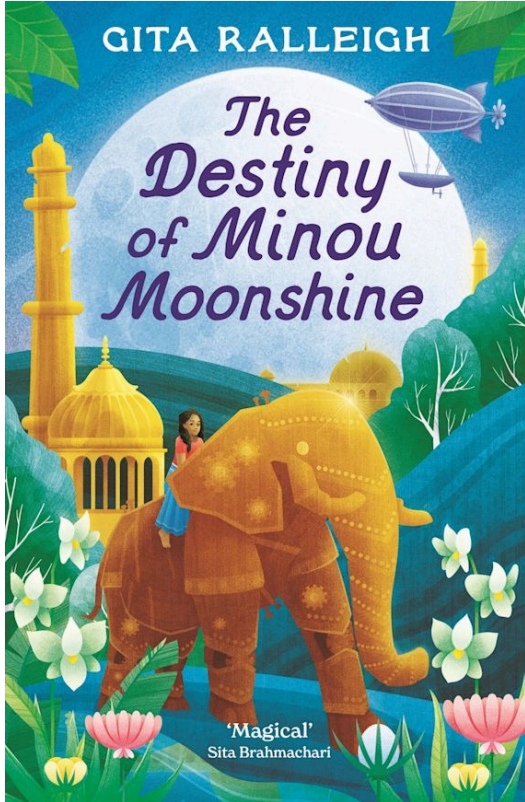

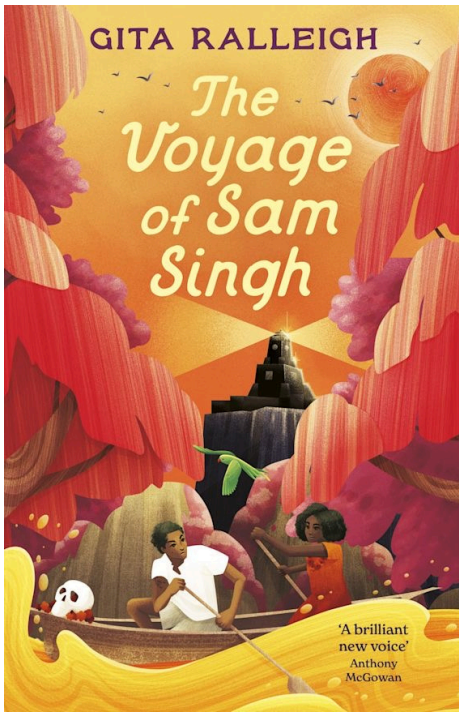

Gita Ralleigh grew up reading fantasy adventures that took her to faraway lands. The closest she came was on family holidays to India, where old palaces, ice-capped mountains, monkeys and elephants were part of everyday life. After a career as a medical doctor, she received an MA in Creative Writing and published short stories and two poetry books (*Siren*, *A Terrible Thing*) before her children’s novels. She lives in London and teaches creative writing to undergraduates at Imperial College. Gita enjoys giving poetry and storytelling workshops in primary and secondary schools, universities, libraries and other community settings and has spoken at the Hay Festival, Imperial College, Greenwich Literature Quiz and for the Sher Jung Foundation ‘Author Talks’ Series.
